Kaja Kallas – an inconvenient witness to the Russian rewriting of history



The **appointment** of Estonian Prime Minister Kaja Kallas as the first EU diplomat is dramatically irritating Moscow.

From Moscow's point of view, Kaja Kallas is not an average civilian and politician, but someone who can influence European legislation and policy in relation to Russia's version of history.
